

MEDICAL COMMANDER ACTION CARD

A. En-route

Establish communications with HEAS Incident Management Team

B. Along with the Ambulance Commander, form part of the multi-agency Incident Management Team on site

Establish and maintain close liaison with: Ambulance Commander, Police Commander, Fire Brigade Commander.

- C. Review the incident and report to the Medical Controller detailing:
- · Nature and location of incident;
- · Confirm number of casualties and respective triage categories
- · Any hazards;
- · Best approach route;
- · Ambulance Staging Area;
- · Assessment of casualty numbers/severity of injuries;
- Assessment of ASNSW resources required;
- Medical team requirements;
- Support agency requirement (St John and Red Cross VASC);
- · Special transport requirements e.g. buses, air, water, rail, etc.
- D. Confirm ideal choice has been made for:
- · Ambulance Staging Area
- · Loading Point
- Casualty Clearing Area
- E. Maintain momentum of patient flow
- F. Appoint the Triage Officer(s) (in liaison with the Ambulance Commander). The Triage Officer will be the most experienced person available, not necessarily the most senior or most qualified.
- G. Keep contemporaneous log of:
- · Decision making for subsequent reviews
- Hospital assignments of patients (Suggest appointing scribe)
- H. Brief and deploy Medical Teams as they arrive on site.
- I. Conduct welfare checks and maintain logs of medical team duration within incident.
- J. Liaise with Medical Manager regarding ongoing medical tema shifts for relief of teams within protracted events.
- · On completion of the incident, advise:
- · All Medical Teams;
- · Medical Controller.
- · Supervise collection of all Retrieval equipment and departure from site.
- · Contribute to "Hot" debrief.
